2010 NFMS Convention and Annual Meeting

Dates: September 17, 18, 19, 2010

Location: Washington County Fairgrounds in Hillsboro, Oregon with the Hotel B serving as Convention Headquarters and the location of an Awards

Breakfast on Sunday the 19th.

The NFMS Executive Board has agreed to hold the 2010 NFMS Annual Meeting on Saturday, September 18th at the Washington County Fairgrounds, Hillsboro, Oregon. Please mark your calendar.

The meeting will be held in a building adjacent to the Portland Regional Gem & Mineral Show which will be held on that same weekend. The cost of the \$525.00 building rental is to be paid by the NFMS.

Though arrangements and cooperative plans have yet to be completely finalized, the Portland Regional Show Committee has graciously allowed us to use their dates and location for our annual meeting and to provide space in their show for competitive cases to be viewed and judged. Non-competitive displayers will need to work directly with the Portland Regional Show Committee and at the Committee's discretion. A Competition Entry Form can be found in this issue of the *Northwest Newsletter*.

An Awards Breakfast is planned for making the usual competitive case and NFMS trophy awards, NFMS officer installations, and Editors' awards. This Awards Breakfast is planned for Sunday morning at 8:00 am at the Hotel B, which is adjacent to the Washington County Fairgrounds. There is an \$18.00 per person cost for the buffet breakfast. No additional costs are expected if the attendance meets the minimum requirements.

All interested NFMS members are urged to attend both the annual meeting and the Awards Breakfast as well as enjoy the excellent gem and mineral show put on by the Portland Regional Gem & Mineral Show Committee.

A special rate of \$69 per room per night is available for a special block of 25 rooms at Hotel B – first come basis. It is expected that dry camping at the Fairgrounds will be available through the Portland Regional Show Committee at rates determined by them.



2010 NFMS Mid-Year Meeting April 17, 2010



Obituary--Doug Anderson

On January 2, the Marcus Whitman Gem and Mineral Society was saddened by the loss of one of its life members with the passing of long time Walla Walla resident Victor "Doug" Anderson at the age of 86. Doug was born July 31, 1923, in Tacoma to Victor and Selma Olson Anderson. He attended Oregon State University before graduating from Klamath Falls Technical Institute with a degree in engineering. YOUR RELATIONSHIP TO IT AND HOW IT WORKS

The AFMS was created by the Northwest Federation, California Federation, Rocky Mountain Federation, and the Mid West Federations. The Eastern Federation and South Central Federation was taken from the Rocky Mountain Federation and the Southeast Federation was taken from the southern part of the Eastern Federation. Unlike other corporations that are created from the top down you could say that the AFMS was created from the middle up.

NFMS are the initials for the Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies, AFMS are the initials for the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies. The AFMS is made up of seven (7) regional federations, covering all of the United States. They are, South Central Federation of Mineralogical Societies, Mid West Federation of Mineralogical Societies, Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies, Southeast Federation of Mineralogical Societies, Rocky Mountain Federation of Mineralogical Societies, California Federation of Mineralogical Societies, and Eastern Federation of Mineralogical and Lapidary Societies. The reason for listing the federations in this order is, that like the NFMS, the AFMS President is only president for one year and each year the president is from a different federation, and rotates from one Federation to the next in the order that is listed above.

The AFMS officers for this year are: President-Emerson Tucker, South Central Federation; President-Elect-Bob Miller, Mid West Federation; 1st Vice President-Rocky McCall, Northwest Federation; 2nd Vice President-Ann Monroe, Southeast Federation; 3rd Vice President-Judy Beck, Rocky Mountain Federation; 4th Vice President-Marion Roberts, California Federation; and 5th Vice President-Matt Charsky, Eastern Federation. To be an AFMS Vice President each regional Federation elects the individual that it wants to be AFMS Vice President or President Elect. So far, the President Elect is automatically President the following year. The President Elect needs that year in order to prepare the budget and get individuals to fill positions, just like the 1st Vice President in the NFMS needs to.

In the NFMS to be eligible for one of the above positions you have to be a past NFMS President, and only Past NFMS Presidents can vote. This is voted on every year. The AFMS policy is that an individual can only be a Vice President for two (2) years in a row, and then must rotate out for at least one year before that individual can come back as a Vice President again.

Exception, an individual can be 1st Vice President then President Elect then President. To be President Elect the individual must have served in one of the AFMS Vice Presidents positions.

The NFMS year is from September 1 to August 31 while the AFMS year is from November 1 to October 31.



DEADLINE for entry: April 15, 2010

CLASSES FOR ENTRIES

Class I -Educational - about geology, minerals, gems, fossils, etc.

Class 2 -<u>Field Collecting</u> - showing site(s), specimens, with some geology, collecting methods and other aspects of interest.

Class 3 - "How To Do It" - techniques/equipment for fossil prep. jewelry, metal work, carving, faceting, other lapidary, etc.

Class 4 - "Just for Juniors" - any of the above for/by youngsters.

"Excellence in Education" entries are judged separately.

- a script (written narration indicating when each slide is to be projected) preferably typed, ready for duplication.
 (sample formats are available upon request) Script on a "floppy" or CD is very helpful but not required.

AWARDS

A \$200 cash prize for the highest scoring program (with 95+ points), \$100 if score is 94 - 90 points, (for highest score) in each Class 1 - 4. In addition, Winners receive national recognition.



A. NFMS Juniors Committee Chairman shall promote this Award, including the past and present Winners, throughout the entire year at every appropriate opportunity.

- 1. Official announcement of the upcoming contest along with the rules and application will be published during February and March in the Northwest Newsletter and on the NFMS Website Juniors Page. The rules and application will remain all year on the NFMS Website Juniors Page and applications can be downloaded.
- 2. Completed applications and resumes will be due each year with a postmark deadline on the first day of April.

 This will be the same date each annual cycle.
- 3. After receiving the applications and resumes, the Juniors Committee Chairman shall make copies and send with score sheets to the NFMS President, 1st VP, and 2nd VP, to be judged and returned by April 15. The Juniors Committee Chairman shall also judge each application.

After all judged applications are returned, the scores will be tallied and winners determined by the Juniors Committee Chairman.

- 4. Juniors Committee Chairman will notify the Junior Achievement Award Winners and their parents/guardians by the first day of May. This will be the same date each annual cycle. Thence allowing time to plan for the Awards Banquet at the NFMS Annual Show and Convention where the Awards are to be presented.
- 5. Junior Achievement Award Winners and their families can attend the Awards portion of the Banquet without dining and buying a Banquet ticket or they can purchase Banquet tickets in advance like other Award Winners of the evening and enjoy the full evening of dining and Awards. If the Winners do not attend, the Juniors Committee Chairman will make sure they receive their Awards.

B. The NFMS Junior Achievement Award Trust Fund was established in 1989 for the purpose of providing at least one monetary award to the Junior whose submitted resume/outline rates highest in the opinion of the judges. Your age determines whether you enter the age 12 and under category or the age 13 to 18 category. The applicant must not have had an eighteenth birthday prior to the date of application, because then the applicant would no longer be defined as a Junior, but the applicant can turn 18 between application and presentation of the Awards. The judging panel consists of the NFMS President, NFMS 1st VP, NFMS 2nd VP and the Juniors Committee Chairman. Judging is based on the judges' subjective interpretations of the relevant quality of the applicant's resume/outline. The Award is presented to a Junior applicant who is a member in good standing with a Rock Club affiliated with the Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies. The Junior applicant should be active in our hobby, education & school, community and work related achievements. The primary Award Winner will receive a certificate, a check, a pen set and his/her name on the legendary plague. More than one Award Winner is possible, depending on the entries and ages of participants. Each participating Junior MUST personally author their written resume/outline. Your application, score sheet and resume/outline MUST BE POSTMARKED by the first day of April.
