







Special Tour on Sunday May 22 of the Coyote Canyon Mammoth dig site

We have made arrangements with the staff at the Coyote Canyon Mammoth dig site near Kennewick to bring out a maximum of 30 people to visit the site. We will plan to caravan from the Benton County Fairgrounds main parking lot, leaving at noon to travel to the site. **The first 30 people** to send me an email using the subject line **"Mammoth Site tour"** will be put on a list. Put your name and a phone number in the email, along with the number in your party. Please, no large parties so others may also attend. The site is accessed off main roads and on a short stretch of gravel road. The tour will last about two hours, allowing those that want to return to the Lakeside Show time to get there before it closes at 4pm. Dress for weather conditions. Please wear sturdy shoes suitable for walking on uneven ground. Tennis shoes are OK, but no open toe sandals or flip flops. Hats and sunscreen are highly recommended. Also be advised that rest room facilities are limited to a portable toilet near the dig site. Use of a mask is optional indoors at the facility, so bring one along in case it is needed. A liability waiver form will be available for completion at the Mid-Year meeting, as will driving directions. The liability form must be completed for each person attending and brought to the site with you. Parents must sign for minor children. All adult tour attendees must also sign in upon arrival at the facility and note the number of children in their group.

Mr. George Last – AFMS Scholarship Foundation Honoree for 2022

Mr. George Last has been selected as the AFMS Scholarship Foundation "honoree" for 2022. He is the Geology Research Coordinator for The Mid-Columbia Basin Old Natural Education Sciences (MCBONES) Research Center Foundation (Coyote Canyon Mammoth site) and adjunct faculty member at WSU Tri-Cities. MCBONES has operated since 2008 and has provided local Tri-Cities, Washington school students and teachers an opportunity to actively participate in laboratory and field-based research in paleontology, geology, paleoecology, and other natural sciences. The MCBONES organization continues to provide the community, local clubs (e.g. Lakeside Gem & Mineral Club), and interested parties tours of the site and educates the public in the geologic history of the Columbia Basin.

George has degrees in Geology and Environmental Science from WSU and retired from Pacific Northwest National Laboratory in 2016. He has also written numerous technical reports, journal articles and field guides on the geology and hydrogeology of the Hanford Site and southeastern Washington. George is interested in the Missoula floods and their impacts on mammoths and other Pleistocene animals. In addition to his work on the Coyote Canyon Mammoth Site, he has also been the principal investigator for the Frenchman Hills – Tonnemaker Mammoth Site. He is an active member of the Geological Society of America, Northwest Scientific Association, and Ice Age Floods Institute.

Mr. Last has consented to be our guest speaker at the 2022 banquet in Hillsboro OR. The two students that will receive scholarships have also been invited to attend. I have also offered him the opportunity to have a display at the show that weekend. I encourage everyone to attend the show and banquet and learn more about the MCBONES Foundation and the exciting research that is being conducted there.

RESOLUTION

Background: At the September 11, 2021, Annual NFMS Meeting it was suggested that the Endowment Fund Committee look into adding the 2nd NFMS Vice President position to the Endowment Fund Committee membership. The committee, at the time, discussed this and agreed with the suggestion. The addition would provide the incumbent an additional year to become familiar with committee activities as well as provide for more committee stability as the incumbent would now serve for two years on the committee. NFMS President Larry Hulstrom, using his authority to assign duties to officers, assigned the current incumbent in the 2nd Vice President position to the committee for this year.

<u>To make this change permanent, amendments to both the By-Laws and the Operating Procedures are necessary.</u> At the same time these changes are being made we will be making some minor text edits to the operating procedures for the Endowment Fund Committee.

RESOLUTION ADDRESSING DUPLICATE TEXT IN THE NORTHWEST FEDERATION OF MINERALOGICAL SOCIETIES (NFMS) BY-LAWS AND OPERATING PROCEDURES.

Both Article X; Section 2, Standing Committees; Part (c) Composition of Committees, Endowment Fund Committee of the By-Laws of the Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies (NFMS) and the NFMS Operating Procedures OP Committee - 3. Endowment Committee section titled COMMITTEE COMPOSITION <u>list the membership of the Endowment Fund Committee</u>. This is unnecessary duplication and causes extra work and possible confusion when making changes to the committee composition.

The Endowment Fund committee proposes the following amendment to the NFMS By-Laws to eliminate duplication of text that is also included in the NFMS Operating Procedures.

Under <u>Article X; Section 2, Standing Committees; Part (c) Composition of Committees, Remove the following: Endowment Fund</u> <u>Committee</u>, shall be composed of: <u>Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Advisor, and NFMS 1st Vice President in its entirety.</u>

The result is there would be no reference to committee composition in the by-laws. Committee composition is detailed in the operating procedures under OP Committee -3 Endowment Fund Committee, Committee Composition section.

A Resolution to amend NFMS Operating Procedures

The Endowment Fund Committee offers the following resolution to amend OP COMMITTEE -3, ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE to correct the title, remove extraneous text and add an additional member to the committee.

- --Insert the word **Fund** in the title of the section to read: OP Committee -3 Endowment Fund Committee
- --Remove the first line of text below the title line of the section which reads "Subject: Implementation of OP GENERAL 3" as the wording is not applicable to the section.

--Under OP COMMITTEE – 3, ENDOWMENT FUND COMMITTEE, <u>COMMITTEE COMPOSITION</u> : after the words NFMS 1st Vice President, add <u>NFMS 2nd Vice President</u>. The new text under <u>COMMITTEE COMPOSITION</u> would read: **Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, Financial Advisor, NFMS 1st Vice President, and NFMS 2nd Vice President.**
