

### Rock Stamps of the Month - B

Our highlighted country of the month is Botswana. I'm sure you are familiar with Botswana Banded Agate, so this was the first stamp that came to mind. This is one of a set of 14 frp, 1974. Not surprisingly, banded agates show up on a lot of stamps worldwide because of their colorful imagery.



We also have stamps depicting Beryl from Mozambique (1979)



and Beryllium from Portugal (1971).

Finally, we have a stamp with Barite from Somalia, which is considered a "Cinderella Stamp" from 1997. It was released for sale to collectors, but not actually used for postage. This happens a lot for topical stamps from the 1990s to today.
