Enjoy your summer and travel safe.




### Judi Allison 2<sup>nd</sup> VP

# **Roscoe Elden McCall** "Rocky" July 11, 1935 – **April 30, 2010**

Roscoe Elden McCall was born July 11, 1935 in Brewster, Wash., and

passed away from cancer at his home in Stanwood April 30, 2010 while surrounded by family. He was preceded in death by his father John McCall and mother Martha Morehouse.

Rocky is survived by Loretta C. Malm, his wife of 54 years, and his children Elden, Ellen Hagen and her husband Ronnie, Donald and his wife Rebecca, and Daniel and his wife Christie. He is also survived by his sisters Nora Kohlhepp and Stella Saylor, 11 grandchildren, 11 greatgrandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews. Rocky was a proud friend of Bill W. for 38 years and has touched countless lives.

Throughout his life Rocky worked in various jobs, such as with Boeing during the construction of both the presidential 707 and the mock-up of the 747, as butcher, timber cruzer, real estate agent, and furniture maker. Rocky worked for 20 years at the Northwest Veterinary Clinic as a veterinary assistant who worked extensively in the embryonic field. Rocky was a member of the Marysville Rock Club. He was a master craftsman and teacher in lapidary work.

For those who met Rocky, he will be remembered for his story telling, wisdom, courage, compassion and genuine friendship. If for some reason you couldn't remember his name, just look for the man with the "Red Hat."

Viewing will be from 9 a.m. to -5 p.m. Wednesday, May 5 at Gilbertson's Funeral Home in Stanwood. The funeral services starts 11 a.m. Thursday, May 6 at Saint Cecilia Catholic Church. Rocky was a member of the North Puget Sound Faceting Guild, the Marysville Rock & Gem Club, the POW WOW Club and there may be others. Rocky was a well-respected rock 'artist' and his favorite form of lapidary was 'Intarsia'—he will be remembered for his beautiful scenic jewelry pieces that he painstakingly glued together and polished. He was recognized throughout the United States and won many prizes. Rocky told me that one of his prized opal intarsia crosses belongs to a Catholic Priest on the East coast.

Not only was Rocky an artist—he was a leader and has been President of his various clubs and the Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies. He currently was a Vice President of the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies. Rocky had charisma, and will most likely be remembered for years by his sense of humor, jokes and story telling and that big wide smile. He was generous with his time and talents and mentored many people over the years with his common sense and can-do attitude. He was a special person to George and I and he will be missed greatly by all who called him 'friend'. We will miss seeing that perpetual smile and his bright red hunting hat with jade cabochons.


