Annual Meeting Notice of Discussion

At the Mid Year meeting in 2022 there was a discussion about changing to an Electronic Newsletter. We revisited that topic at the Mid Year Meeting in Kennewick in April 2023. This will be on the Agenda at the Annual Meeting in Billings in August.

It has become apparent that this change has become necessary. In a review of the Annual Budget, Treasurer's Report and the Endowment Fund Reports from the last couple of years one finds that the Newsletter is the single largest expense of the NFMS. Due to the Decrease in Dues by \$1.00 that was voted in at the 2019 Meeting in Lewiston Idaho the NFMS has had decreased income. This reduction ends after 2024. In order to pay bills, assets from the endowment fund were sold to pay bills. The last time it was \$20K. Over the last couple of years we have spent more than we took in. The Endowment Fund is significantly smaller than it used to be due to this and stock market fluctuations. The revenue from the Endowment Fund is being used to make up the loss of income from Dues Reduction. The Endowment Fund went from \$281,153 in Aug 2022 to \$254,880 in Mar 2023 due to the stock market. WE simply CAN NOT afford to keep depending on the Endowment Fund to make up our shortfalls in Income. I would emphasize that the NFMS is not currently in financial trouble, but this trend is not financially responsible. The Endowment Fund is not supposed to be used to pay Operating Expenses.

In order for the NFMS to remain financially healthy for the long term there are two options as far as I see. An increase of dues or a reduction in spending. My guess is that an increase in dues is not going to be popular. The cost of each Newsletter is about \$2000. Each copy about 50 cents per. Six issues costs the NFMS about \$3.00 or more per member/household. Ten issues about \$5.00. That is way more than you currently pay in dues (\$2.50). Keep in mind that part of your dues go to the AFMS so the NFMS really doesn't have much operating money from your dues. You can see those figures in the Treasurers Report, Endowment Fund Report which will be part of the packet at the Annual Meeting.

Currently the cost of Newsletter at six issues is expected to be up to \$14,000 for 2023. That is the minimum number of issues. Ten is the maximum. That would cost over \$20,000. Those costs will increase as inflation increases. An Electronic Newsletter would be pretty much Zero Cost. I would expect these savings can be used to do things like upgrade the NFMS Library to digital format and help keep the Endowment Fund intact.

I am asking that you consider this as I will be calling for a vote to accept this change. That is the first step in the process. It is expected that the change would be implemented sometime in early 2024. The details of how this will be implemented will be worked out in coming months. It should actually be fairly straightforward to get this done. As I will be leaving the Presidency this year I expect the incoming President will keep everyone informed and make it happen smoothly and efficiently.

NFMS Scholarship Honoree

The Northwest Federation of Mineralogical Societies has selected Dr. Robert C. Thomas as the Scholarship Honoree for 2023. Dr. Thomas is a Regents Professor of Geology in the Environmental Sciences Department at the University of Montana Western. He received the Carnegie /CASE U.S Professor of the Year Award in 2009. He was appointed a Regents Professor by the Montana University System in 2010. He is a Fellow of the Geological Society of America, Montana Regents Teaching Scholar, recipient of the Humbolt State University Distinguished Alumni Award, the Geological Society of America Distinguished Service Award, the University of Montana Geoscience Alumnus Award and co-recipient of the Mike Malone Montana Educator of the Year Award.

He has co-authored over 75 publications including Roadside Geology of Yellowstone Country and Roadside Geology of Montana (2020 edition) which was awarded the 2021 High Plains Book Award. In 2020 he created the Montana Geology Facebook Page which has over 12,000 members. He currently works on sedimentation along the northern margin of the Yellowstone hot spot, remediation of grazing impacts on stream function, metal contamination on the upper Clark Fork and layperson books on the geology of Montana. He teaches summer geology courses for the Yellowstone Institute, the Yellowstone-Bighorn Research Association and serves as a technical advisor for the Clark Fork Coalition and the Nature Conservancy of Montana. He is deeply passionate about experiential education, using Western Montana's Immersion Scheduling System to engage students in authentic experience in the earth sciences.


